## RIVER SURVEILLANCE REPORT #7

**DATE:** April 25, 2015      **TIME:** 10:00 a.m.

A river surveillance flight was taken this morning and the following was noticed at the locations listed below:

***South Bluff Creek*** – Broken up to mouth with moderate to high water

***Bushy Island South End*** – Still intact with water rising along shore

***French River*** – Broken up to about 1.5 miles from mouth with moderate – high water

***Kwatabohegan River*** – Broken up to mouth with moderate to high water behind it

***Abitibi River*** – Still intact with water rising

***Cheepash River*** – Broken up to mouth with moderate to high water behind it

***Moose River (main river)*** – Break up has reached Hancock Creek (8 miles from community), it has moved slightly causing major fractures in the ice in front of the old reserve down river from French River with moderate to high water behind which is normal for this time of year, ice pack continues to grow due to ice floating down river from shore line, fingers of broken ice are trying to break through the solid ice – no change has occurred over night

***Missinaibe*** – Broken up with ice chunks floating down river, Moderate to high water

Ice is continuing to rot and melt creating holes and water along both sides of the river and around islands in the Moose River

**We are currently at Alert Level 3-Warning Alert** due to break up being within 20 miles from the community

**The flow rates and water levels that are monitored at Moose River** is not rising but is still at a high level and that is expected this time of year. All other rivers/creeks have high water which is normal for this time of year.

**Another Flight will take place to monitor the water levels and progress of break-up**
