Harvesting and Technology

With the coming age of new technology to make life easier. Drones are becoming more affordable and commonplace. We remind that using a drone (any aircraft) to hunt is illegal. This law aligns with our traditional laws as well. To harvest we need to respect the wildlife which sustains us. It is highly disrespectful and unethical to something that deserves so much respect. In the spirit of fair and safe harvesting it is wise to observe the following laws based on ethical resource management, conservation and sustainability for future generations.

Aircraft and Vehicles

It is unlawful:

to chase or harass any wildlife with any aircraft, motor vehicle, boat, snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle of any type.

to hunt any wildlife with, or possess any loaded firearm on, any aircraft, motor vehicle, snow machine, or all-terrain vehicle of any type. Such vehicles may be used for transportation to and from a hunting area and for transporting any game taken, except where restrictions apply to the use of all-terrain vehicles.

to use any aircraft to search for or locate any wildlife for hunting on your own behalf, or on behalf of any other person.

Hunting at Night

It is unlawful to hunt any game with night lights of any description.

Wounded Animals

Any person who kills, cripples or wounds any game animal shall make all reasonable efforts to retrieve that animal.

Safe Hunting Practises

Do not consume alcohol

Wear high visibility clothing

Identify your target: make sure you know what's in front of and beyond the target
