ROAD USAGE INFORMATION

Moose Cree First Nation would like to remind the public about the general usage conditions while the road is open:

- > The road is open to privately owned, licensed and insured vehicles only.
- > The road is use at your own risk. Drivers are asked to use caution while on the road as it is a winter seasonal road with natural bumps, ice, and occasional soft spots.
- > The Maximum Vehicle Weight Class is up to a standard sized 4 x 4 pickup trucks. Cars, vans, and SUVs are permitted but please drive according to conditions.
- > Please obey speed limits for the safety of you, your passengers, and other drivers.
- > Please buckle up for the safety of you and your passengers.
- > Please obey all signs on the road and yield to all contracting equipment on the road.
- > Please do not litter or throw debris on the road. Respect the land and environment that was provided for you to drive on.
- > Random police check points may be established for the safety of you and our community.

Otter Rapids Road is situated between the Wetum Road and Fraserdale. It is a hilly, curvy road and is maintained less frequently than other areas, especially on weekends. Use caution in this area.

It is encouraged that users of the road refrain from any hunting, harvesting of wood, or using the road for any purpose other than transportation to visit our neighbors to the south.

Moose Cree First Nation values the protection and conservation of our natural resources in our homelands and this seasonal road is a short window of road connection to the south. We thank all of the dedicated workers, the contractors, Moose Cree Group of Companies, and the funding sources that make this road a reality every year.
